Jacquie has built a legacy of accomplishments in the theater arts. As a founding member of Henley Street Theatre, she helped develop and sustain both

its artistic and financial success and was instrumental in helping steer Henley's recent merger with Richmond Shakespeare to become Quill Theatre. "I have been so blessed to be embraced by the Richmond theatre family. Being a part of Henley Street Theatre and Quill Theatre were rare opportunities for me to give back to a community that is so extraordinarily supportive of the arts. I look forward to continuing to be an active part of the theatre scene in Richmond!" – Jacquie

Since moving to Richmond from New York almost 30 years ago, she has played vital and diverse roles in the region's vibrant theater scene. Jacquie has excelled as a theater founder, managing director, marketer, fund developer, arts teacher, producer, actress and stage manager. She has served in leadership and advocacy roles for local and statewide theater networks and associations. Jacquie was the recipient of Style Weekly's 2014 Women in the Arts Award, and won the 2014 Richmond Theatre Critics Circle award for Best Supporting Actress in a Play for her work in *Good People*. She was also awarded the Phoebe Award from the Richmond Times Dispatch for Best Supporting Actress in a Musical for *Jekyll and Hyde*, and received a Richmond Theatre Critics Circle nomination for Best Supporting Actress in a Musical for *Musical, the Musical of Musicals*. Jacquie holds a Bachelor of Arts in Theatre from Shenandoah Conservatory.

Jan will step in to her new role July 1, leading and directing Quill Theatre as we prepare to open *The Merchant of Venice* at the 18th Annual Richmond Shakespeare Festival at Agecroft Hall.
